Cindy is a well-known turner and teacher as well as a frequent demonstrator at local clubs and regional, national and international woodturning symposiums. Her work, along with tools and accessories, may be viewed at www.cindydrozda.com.

Cindy describes the Fabulous Finial Box demonstration by stating, "In this demonstration, I show how to turn my signature style of Box with a finial, an in-fitting lid, and an inlayed decorative ring and foot made from contrasting wood. The Finial Box is an intricate, and interesting, project, with a lot of tips and techniques. This presentation includes box-making, turning a finial, design, material selection, and jam chucking."

More about Interactive Remote Demonstrations:

Some further insight into IRDs from Cindy:

- 1. What is an Interactive Remote Demonstration (IRD)? IRD is where the club connects to the demonstrator via the internet, using video conferencing software, and downloads the demonstrator's live video. Attendees can ask questions and make comments during the presentation.
- 2. What is an Interactive Remote Meeting? This is an IRD where some or all of the club members are connecting from remote locations, such as from home. It is a great way to allow participation from members who are away from home, ill, caring for a family member, unable to drive at night, disabled, or for any number of reasons can't come to the physical meeting. The entire meeting attendance can be joining remotely.
- 3. What hardware can the attendee use to hook up to the meeting? It can be viewed on any device that can connect to the internet and show video. So, phone, tablet, laptop, desktop, etc. It's best to have a large enough screen to actually see the demo. But combinations of devices are possible too. For instance, join with iPhone, and view via a lightning to HDMI cable on a TV or monitor. Or join with PC and output to larger monitor or use laptop screen, use external or internal speakers, internal camera or webcam or no camera at all if you don't care to show your face. Join with desktop for video, and cell phone for audio. Lots of possibilities.
- 4. During the meeting, members can communicate with each other or with the whole group via Chat. The moderator will field questions and answer Chats if needed.

Always check the speed of the lathe before you turn it on! Ensure the lathe speed is compatible with the size of the blank.

For bowls, consider Dale Nish's mathematical formula as a *starting point* for lathe speed:

RPM x Diameter (inches) = 6000 - 9000

Remember, your safety is your responsibility!






