


## October's Demo: Eddie Bell & Ornamental Turning

Last month we participated in an introduction to ornamental turning using a Rose Engine Lathe. We joined Eddie Bell in his shop and he showed us his Rose Engine Lathes and some other antique tools. During this introduction we were shown the basics of how a Rose Engine Lathe works, the best selection of woods for this type of turning and he featured the lathe in action. This type of turning requires many hours to produce a finished piece, so Eddie shared some pieces done in stages to be able to show us a finished piece.

The art of ornamental turning goes back about 500 years. It probably started in Germany, but the zenith was in France, and especially England in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, when it was a popular hobby for kings and wealthy gentry. During this time, science, mathematics and industry were dramatically advancing and all that learning was being applied to ornamental turning. The material of choice was elephant ivory, at that time, and museums in Europe are full of fantastic examples. So many in fact, that there are huge collections in storage that can be seen by special appointment at museum reserve warehouses, especially in London and Paris.

The earliest rose engine Eddie has seen is in England and dates to sometime in the sixteen hundreds. Remarkably, there is almost no metal employed in the construction, it is mostly all made of wood including the bed, headstock and rosettes. This machine is still functional and is being used. There were two main groups of machines used, the ornamental lathe and the rose engine. Ornamental lathes are based on a standard lathe that could be used for metal turning or free-hand turning of wood. What makes them ornamental is the addition of accessories and modifications to the headstock for indexing. Rose engines are purpose built and differ from ornamental lathes in that the spindle is fixed to a pivot point below the lathe bed and rosettes (multi-lobed cams) are employed to cause the spindle to rock back and forth or pump from right to left while the work is slowly turning, usually at about 3 RPM. The cutting is done with fly cutters, drills or by fixed tools that shave the work with very sharp form tools that take off a third of a thousandth of an inch per revolution.



## Green Wood Available

The Green Wood Committee is always grabbing green wood in the community and keeping it out of the landfill. There are endless projects that can be done with green wood.

Additionally, green wood can be roughed to a shape and preserved with PVA glue, wax, Anchorseal (see Marketplace) or latex paint to slow the drying time and reduce checking.





## **Web-Based Credit Card Dues Payment Now Available**

Most of our NMWT memberships are currently set up on a calendar year basis with expirations at the end of December. So now is the time to start renewing memberships for 2021 and beyond for those who need to (your current membership expiration date should be listed on your membership card).

We are very pleased to announce that you can now pay your membership dues with a credit card on the NMWT website at <https://www.nmwoodturners.org/>. To access online dues payment, simply go to the new “Membership” tab near the top of the homepage and select “Pay Online” from the drop-down menu. This will take you to a secure website managed by Converge, our credit card service provider. There you will find a series of “Buy Buttons” that are clearly labeled with each membership dues option (i.e. 1 Yr Individual Membership \$25, 2 Yr Family Membership \$55, etc.) Simply select the dues option that you want and then hit the “Checkout” button. You will need to fill in all of the contact information on the payment processing page so that the Treasurer can confirm that our membership records are up to date and also so that he can send your new membership card by regular mail. Also, due to some reporting limitations of the Converge website, you will need to once again select the dues option you want from the drop-down menu labeled “Items Purchased”. Fill in your credit card information and hit the “Submit Payment” button to complete the transaction. You should receive an “Order Confirmation” with full details of your purchase by e-mail, and the Treasurer with mail your membership card to you. That’s all there is to it!

You can, of course, still mail a check along with current contact and e-mail information to our Treasurer, Mark Smith at 709 Vista Abajo Dr. NE, Albuquerque, NM 87123. The easy way to do that is to go to that same new “Membership” tab on the NMWT homepage and select “Membership Form” from the drop-down menu. Fill in the form (PLEASE PRINT CLEARLY) and mail it to Mark with your check. Should you have any issues or questions regarding the new Credit Card payment system or if you are not sure if your membership expires at the end of 2020, feel free to call Mark at 505-270-6316 or e-mail him at [mfsmithabq@msn.com](mailto:mfsmithabq@msn.com).

Mark will also start sending out reminder e-mails to those whose memberships expire in December within the next couple of weeks. We hope that the new dues payment option encourages members to renew soon as the club has operated in the red for most of this year due to COVID and the resulting loss of normal revenue streams such as raffles, silent auctions, etc. It is also easier on the Treasurer if the membership renewals are spread out a bit rather than everyone waiting until the last minute to renew.




