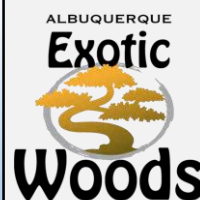

New Mexico State Fair 2022

The New Mexico State Fair is a GO again this year and WE are participating.

As in previous years, our display and demonstrations will be in the Creative Arts Building.

Entries will be accepted on Friday August 26 and Saturday August 27 9:00 am to 5:00 pm both days. To see the Premium Book (State Fair and NMWT rules) online, go to Expo NM, click on State Fair, under Participate click on Competitions, click on Creative Arts, scroll down to 2022 Premium Books, scroll down to woodturners and click one more time and you are there.

Starting last year the NM State Fair Commission charges a \$5 per person entry fee for all Creative Arts entrants. Our Board of Directors has again determined that we will reimburse the \$5 entry fee to all NMWT members entering in the woodturning section.

The State Fair is a fantastic opportunity to show the public some of the useful and beautiful things we can create from a chunk of wood. It also provides an opportunity for us to promote the New Mexico WoodTurners.

2022 State Fair Forms

Entering a turning, or any number of turnings, gets you a written critique of every entry by some of the best turners in New Mexico, and maybe even a ribbon or two.

If you are a member of the American Association of Woodturners or become a member, (you can join instantly online) you can demonstrate at the fair. Our insurance for demonstrators is through the AAW.

The State Fair provides the venue and the ribbons and the NMWT's provide about 460 man/hours to make it all work.

The fair provides free parking, and free admission, and if you request it, transportation for you and your tools to and from the parking lot. Albuquerque Exotic Woods will Provide turning blanks suitable for turning tops, goblets, small end grain bowls, small boxes, bottle stoppers, etc. Or you can bring your own wood and turn whatever you like. When you are in the neighborhood stop by AEW and thank Johnathan for his generosity.

The State Fair is a great opportunity to promote our organization, but we need volunteers to do it.

Look over the sign-up sheets and then PLEASE call me at (505) 400-0266 ASAP to ensure you get the time slots you want. The sign-up sheets will also be available at the July 2 and August 6 meetings.

Beads of Courage is the NMWT's Community Service Project. Beads of Courage, Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) tax exempt organization working in partnership with the American Association of Woodturners (AAW).

This is Local!

Our Beads of Courage Bowls are taken directly to UNMH Children's Cancer Facility here in Albuquerque for local patients. However, some bowls can also be sent to a National collection point in Tucson, Arizona.

UNMH Children's Cancer Facility has been treating nearly one hundred seriously ill cancer youngsters each year. For each medical treatment a child receives, he or she gets a bead which they can then keep in their bowl, hence Beads of Courage Bowls. The children do receive a bag to put their beads in, but a Beads of Courage Bowl is far more special and reflective of the hard work to beat cancer!

NMWT currently produces approximately 8 bowls a year and it would be great to see that number increase exponentially.

Beads of Courage Update

Ron Bahm and I delivered three Beads of Courage (BOC) bowls to the Child Life Department at the UNM Children's Hospital in Albuquerque the 23rd of June. The bonus of this "field trip" was to meet the BOC point of contact for the UNM Children's Hospital, Lacey Anderson, and come away with an understanding of how and why the bowls end up with a particular child. Lacey Anderson is the Beads of Courage contact, among other things, for the UNM Children's Hospital, and thus, the club's point of contact at the hospital. While Scott Eckstein is the club's BOC Chair, we are encouraged to deliver the BOC bowls or vessels to Lacey in person.

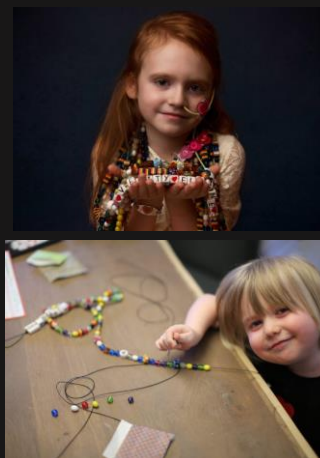
Lacey is a Certified Child Life Specialist, in the Child Life Department, at the UNM Children's Hospital. When I spoke with her, she was very excited that we were interested in supporting the parents and children in the BOC program (she is new to this role). Lacey explained to me that the children have several choices in terms of what they can do with the beads they receive as a result of their surgeries and therapies (such as chemo, etc.) In addition to collecting them in a BOC bowl or vessel, they can put them in a glass vase, string them together to make a necklace, make various art projects, and other creative and expressive things.

I told Lacey that our club would like to know about the child who receives a BOC bowl or vessel (e.g., their story, name and photo), and she said that would not be a problem provided the parents sign a release form.

The BOC program provides a fun and easy way for you to support children coping with a serious illness. If you are moved to create a BOC bowl or vessel, and would like to deliver it in person, call or email Lacey before going to arrange for a time to meet with her. 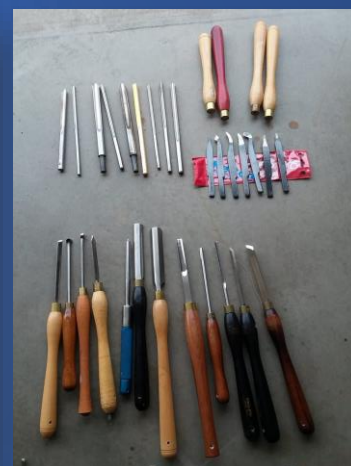

She then proceeded to turn a beautiful genuine mahogany spurtle, explaining the shape and dimensions she had chosen for the project and demonstrating her use of a template to delineate the features of her spurtles.

Laurie gave each of us a blank to make our own spurtles and we encourage all those attending to bring theirs to the next meeting. Thank you, Laurie!

Nancy Matteson demonstrated how to turn a piece of scrap wood into a tea candle holder.

Nancy uses scrap wood for most of these little candle holders and a Forstner bit to drill the hole for the candle.

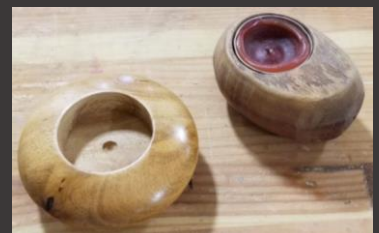

AAW Membership Application

WIT (Women in Turning) is “dedicated to encouraging and assisting women in their pursuit of turning, sharing ideas and processes to further member’s skills and creativity, and increasing participation of women in the field of woodturning.”

The AAW WIT Committee agrees that to further this mission, we can work with chapters to help grow the number of women in AAW. Currently, women comprise less the 9% of AAW membership.

To encourage women to join AAW, the WIT Committee offers a limited number of WIT sponsored half price AAW memberships to women for a one-year, full "General" AAW membership.



Eligibility To be eligible, a grant recipient must be a woman and who has never previously been a member of AAW.

Process Only the chapter AAW WIT Liaison, Kay Grant and Sally Breeden, chapter president or vice-president may request the grant. After we’ve received the application, the recipient will be sent a promotional code with instructions on how to use the code in applying for an AAW membership. If you have questions, please email wit@woodturner.org.

Limitations

If the nominee is a new member of a local chapter (within the last two months), WIT will pay 100% of the AAW membership.

If the nominee has been a member of a local chapter for more than two months, WIT will pay 50% of the AAW membership.

If the nominee is not a member of a local chapter, WIT will pay 50% of the AAW membership.

Grants are currently limited to no more than two women, per chapter, per quarter.

Quarters end January 31, April 30, July 31, and October 31. Based on the number of requests, this limitation may change.

We hope that this offer will be an incentive for new women woodturners to join your chapter.

Turning Tool Basics

The skew, kind of a scary tool for some of us. Yeah maybe, but a very important tool in turning and one you'll come to love once you get the hang of it and practice. Practice, practice, practice is what it takes for us to learn the movements, the angles, the touch needed to make it work magic.

In January of this year we had an excellent skew demo from Jim Echter, the notes and materials are available for all of us on the NMWT website. To the right, you'll see a cut from his article explaining the different parts of a skew. I've also found pictures of some skews so you know exactly what I'm talking about.

Skew angle 70°

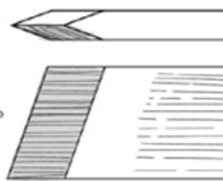


Figure 1. The author recommends beginners use a skew angle of 70° and a bevel angle of 25° to 30°.

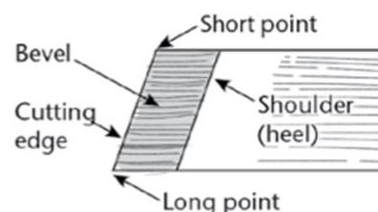


Figure 2. Parts of a skew chisel.

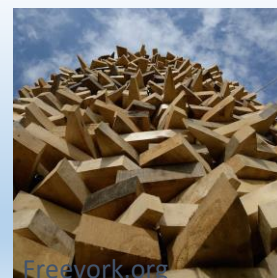
Silent Auction

Here are twenty five or so places to start to dig in. These are some of my favorites that I have used extensively over the first year in my beginning woodturning adventure!

Youtube Channels

1. Worth the Effort - This guy covers it all in great detail. Beware! Lots of talking.
2. Turn A Wood Bowl - Bowl specific, good starting point for all things Bowls!
3. Brian Havens - Detailed explanations of how tools work, without the fluff.
4. Axminster Tools - Look for Colwin Way videos.
5. Mike Waldt - Very experienced at everything woodturning from across the pond.

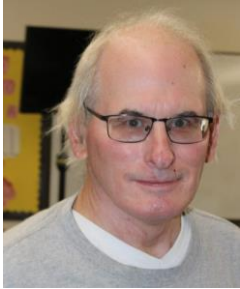

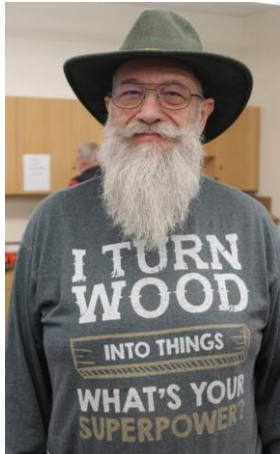

Membership Renewal

Membership Dues

Membership dues renewals are due on or before the last day of the month in which the member's current membership term expires. Members who do not renew within thirty (30) days after their membership expiration date will no longer have access to member privileges and will no longer receive the monthly newsletter. Annual dues are as follows:



One year: \$25 for an individual; \$30 for a family
 Two Years: \$45 for an individual; \$55 for a family
 Three Years: \$65 for an individual; \$80 for a family
 Lifetime: \$300 for an individual; \$350 for a family

Additional Fees

1. An individual member who subsequently adds family members will pay the difference between the individual dues and the family dues rate for the remainder of that membership year (i.e., a one-year individual member adding family members would pay an additional \$5.00 dues for the remainder of the membership year).
2. A member requiring a mailed copy of the monthly newsletter will pay an additional \$10 per year to cover cost of mailing.
