#### PRESIDENTS CORNER



Well, summer is officially upon us, fellow woodturners. And that means thoughts turn to the New Mexico State Fair. Yes, it's not until September, but entry deadlines will be in late August – and that's only next month!!

I want to urge all of you to contribute in one or more of the avenues we have for participation. First, we need entries. We have divisions for Youth, Novice, Intermediate, Advanced and Professional level turners. (Parameters for each level are defined in the annual Premium Book.) Anyone who has seen our display in the past will attest to the amazing and striking array of turned wood we display every year. And remember – this year we will be having a special division for Beads of Courage® Bowls

Second, we need volunteers for the equipment shuffling, check-in, judging, display and check-out prior to and following the fair. While we'd like day-long commitments here,

we'll take any hours you can give. I can think of no better way to get to know fellow turners better than to take part in these tasks.

Third, we need volunteers to demonstrate the art of wood turning to the public over the 10 days of the Fair. We have two lathes, and days are divided into three four-hour shifts, which, along with the shifts for keeping the wood turning DVDs playing during the same hours amounts to some 90 shifts we need to fill. Luckily, most of our veteran demonstrators will sign up for three or four or more shifts, which shows how enjoyable they are. But we need all the help we can get – and then some. The folks passing by our demo area are fascinated with the magic we perform. The kids are especially awed by the little turned toys we hand out. We also need help keeping the wood turning videos showing during the same hours.

And to our lady turners, a special invitation: If you would like to see more of the gentler gender attending our meetings, there is no better way to encourage more women to join up than to let them see you turning. The State Fair is the ideal opportunity for this.

# **JUNE 3 PRESENTATION:**

# **Pyrography: Presentation by Hy Tran**

Safety: Look for UL or CSA certification on woodburning tools. This means the tools were tested by someone other than the manufacturer, even though the manufacturer paid for it. Ventilation is important to keep smoke from your lungs. Use a fan blowing away from you to "suck" the smoke away. The tips of the pens are extremely hot – do not touch them. Clean them only when they are cool. Be sure to have a place to rest hot tools without accidental burning or starting a fire. Have a fire extinguisher handy. Protect yourself from sanding dust.

Metal Effects Paint: Metalic paints are not food safe. Available from Craft Supplies. Be sure to

shake and stir adequately. Apply primer, to prevent tannins in wood from reacting with the metallic paint. Let dry (instructions say 12 hours, but 4-5 should be sufficient in our climate). Apply one of three colors of metal effects paint. Let first coat dry, then apply second coat. Let dry, apply third coat. Before last coat is dry, spray the aging solution on to create oxidation effect on paint. When dry, can be sanded lightly so paint shows though the aging solution.

Pyrography: Refers to the burning or caramelizing of the wood; also changes the texture. You can buy pens or tips or make your own tips out of nichrome wire. Practice on a scrap of wood (or a portion of the blank that will be later turned away) prior to working on the turned vessel. Use various heat settings to determine the best combination of heat, tool tip, and wood species. (Some tips and species may require more or less heat than others.) Experiment with different tips to determine the design elements each is good for. You can even sign you name via burning as opposed to using ink.

You can use pens with permanent tips or replaceable tips. Replaceable tips are a fraction of the cost of a replacement pen. However, the pens get hot. So if you are going to use a particular tip for long periods of time (like with basket illusions), have multiple pens with that tip can be helpful because you can switch pens when one gets too hot for our fingers.

First draw you designs on paper, or buy sets of designs. Transfer designs to the vessel using carbon paper or graphite paper. If using graphite, errors can be easily erased. Trace the design that is on the paper, pushing hard enough to make the carbon paper activate with the wood, leaving the design. Tracing with a pen or pencil to trace allows you to see that all pieces of the design have been transferred. (What you see on the paper is what has been transferred.) Keep records of what combinations worked best for future reference.

JoAnne Smith discussed her pyrography, showing examples of her work on wood and photos. For burning radiating lines (like rays of sunshine), it's best to rotate the vessel rather than

try to twisting your wrist. Note that one pyrography tool tip can have widely varying effects on end grain vs. face grain vs. side grain.

Hot sand: Heat clean sand to 500 degrees F. Place small pieces of wood into sand for 1 minute plus. This gives the wood a burned effect without the flame. Likely to need to get the wood up to 300 degrees. The required temperature varies with the type of wood, thus experiment with the type of wood you're using. Note: Most of these effects can be achieved with an small artisan's butane or propane torch. Using a torch on end grain and scrubbing with a wire brush can create great design effects

#### **BEADS OF COURAGE**

Beads of Courage challenge: We need enough entries to fill a display case at the State Fair this year. Don't be shy, we can do it. The size of the box, as a minimum, must be 5 inches wide x 6 inches deep. These boxes do not have to be round, they can also square. Of course, you can make them larger, to allow the kiddo's to put all their beads in a safe place. Go to www.beadsofcourage.org to see to whom you will be making these boxes. Don't forget to bring your boxes to the meetings, and put them into the instant gallery. Scott Eckstein is our official representative for the local hospitals, give him your box(s) for delivery to the hospitals.
