#### **Safety Note:**

As woodturners, a tool we use frequently is a bandsaw: We use the bandsaw to shape blanks (for example, rounding square blanks). A frequently given piece of advice is to always keep your hands and fingers at least 3 inches away from the bandsaw blade, and to use the eraser-end of an unused pencil to clear cutoffs from the bandsaw. I would like to emphasize that you should not have your hands "in the line of fire" even if your hands are still more than 3 inches away from the bandsaw blade. Take the time to build a cutting sled or cutting fixture. If you feel more resistance, don't apply more force! Stop and diagnose why the cut is not going smoothly (it could be as simple as the gullets of the blade are clogged and need to be cleaned).

If you really want to know, I can share with you a photo of my stitches at a future club meeting (yes, fortunately, I still have all ten fingers).

#### **Credit Card/Debit Cards**

Hot news off the pyrography machine! New Mexico Woodturners can accept your credit or debit card for payment for club dues and club apparel! Our treasurer has a card reader from the club's bank that can be used to read your credit or debit card. (Technically, we could accept payment for other items too, but we'd prefer not to take credit or debit card payment for small amounts, as the fees would mess things up)

### JUNE 2018 PRESENTATION:

#### Inside – Out Turning - Ray Berry

When Ray was asked to do this demo a few months back, Ray said I needed a couple of months to see if I could still make them as I had not made any in over 10+ years. The ones I made at that time were small Christmas ornaments so I needed to bone up on 'how to'. Needless to say, I make every mistake possible. They can be challenging but also very fun.

Starting with 4 blocks of wood (pen blanks are a good start and most of us have a few laying around) turn the 'inside' silhouette while the blanks are glued/taped/chucked (this is temporary) on your lathe, spindle turned--paying attention to not cut to deep.

Now the blocks are reversed and glued back together and the 'outside' is finished" - Ray.

Find 2 pcs of wood that have at least two parallel surfaces (such as pen blanks size).

Using double-sided turners tape, tape 2 pcs together lengthwise. Note you can also glue craft paper between 2 pcs, but will have to allow for drying time.

Drill small holes in the center of each end of the 2 pcs that are stuck together. The drill hole should line up with the seam between the 2 pcs, this will allow the drive center and live center to push into place w/o separating the 2 pcs.

Mount between centers. I prefer the top of the future ornament towards headstock.

Determine the shape you're going to turn (snowman, Christmas tree, Christmas bulb, etc) and cut 1/2 of that image near the center of the mounted pieces. Keep in mind that these pieces will be reversed, so don't cut too deep into the pieces. Sand the cut surfaces once shape is finished to your satisfaction. (If you want to add color to what will be the interior image, now is the time).

Take the 2 pcs off the lathe, separate at the taped seam, turn 180 degrees so the cut images are together in the center of the wood, glue together with wood glue and clamp. Let glue dry at least 30 minutes.

Once dry, again, drill small hole centered on the end. Remount on lathe between centers. Cut small tenons so both ends can be mounted on 4-jaw chuck.

Mount on chuck with bottom end towards headstock and top end towards tailstock. Using a Jacobs chuck in the tailstock, drill a small hole at the top end thru the center of the ornament. This is where you can fish a string for hanging the ornament.

Reverse the piece so the top of the ornament is in the chuck. Go ahead and support with live center for as long as possible.

Turn a finial at the bottom end, working back towards the area where the cutout exists. Be careful not to cut too far in the piece where the cutout exists. At some point, the live center can be removed and the very end of the finial can be completed.

Once the finial end is complete, start cuts that mimic the image in the cutout. Be careful of how your cuts will interact with the cutout image. Turn off the lathe very often to make sure your cuts are not cutting "through" the cutout image and that there is enough wood left to support the piece. Finish cutting around the interior shape, working from bottom to top of ornament (tailstock to headstock). Sand the outside on the lathe while you still have enough support to do so, but you should be almost finished with the ornament at this time.

Your final cut will create a bulb, sphere, or other shape at the top of the ornament, then, use a cut-off tool to separate the ornament from the chucked wood.

A little final sanding, and perhaps some sealer if desired for outer surfaces. String some thread through the hole on the top and tie off. You can add some last minute color, maybe a ribbon or small bow if you like.

This is a great project for all skill levels.

### Report from Hy Tran

Dear fellow woodturners: In January 2018, your current club officers and committee chairs, along

with the 2017 officers and chairs, met at Larry Linford's house for an all-day strategic planning session. John Ellis facilitated and recorded the meeting notes. The full report is 4 pages long, and available for anyone interested: Just contact me by e-mail. I would like to summarize here some of the results, though:

- The New Mexico Woodturners vision is to be the known leader in woodturning arts and crafts in central New Mexico
- Our mission is to educate the community towards safe and enjoyable use of woodturning practices and be a resource for all woodturners.

The club also identified six five objectives that we want to achieve, as part of our goals and strategies:

- More effective communication, especially outside our club membership and circle
- Find long-term space solution (complete)
- Grow membership
- Increase participation
- Increase board activities to members
- Achieve financial stability

In the August newsletter, I will provide more details of the club strategic planning results. In the meantime, the club would like to establish a few committees to help with specific goals and objectives:

- Introduction to membership committee: Reach out to new club members
- Outreach to local stores committee: Improve our visibility at Woodworkers' Supply, Precision Sharpening, and other local stores
- Instruction committee: Organize and schedule both full (multi-day) instruction (spindle, faceplate turning) and shorter informal (one day or half-day) sessions
- Other outreach: State Fair, Explora demos, other demos, displays at libraries and other places, etc.

If you have an interest in any of the above topics, we'd love your help! (Hint: If you are interested in, say, instruction, the best way of getting the

class scheduled to your liking is to be on the instruction committee!)

#### **BEADS OF COURAGE**

Beads of Courage: The size of the box, as a minimum, must be 5 inches wide x 6 inches deep. These boxes do not have to be round, they can also square. Items not sold will be returned to the owner and the owner will remove the items from Woodworkers Supply.
