"Pyrography"- Hy Tran

The June demonstration will be a burning question on everyone's mind: What is pyrography? Your last minute guest will demonstrate methods to decorate wood using pyrography. A number of pyrography tools will be demonstrated on flat wood. In addition, other wood surface treatments (metal effects paints and oxidized metal finishes) will be demonstrated (again, on flat wood). Although our coverage will be superficial, we anticipate a very colorful time!

"It is the policy of the American Association of Woodturners (AAW) that the process known as Fractal Burning is prohibited from being used in any AAW-sponsored events, including regional and national symposia, and that AAW-chartered chapters are strongly urged to refrain from demonstrating or featuring the process in chapter events. Further, the process of Fractal Burning shall not be featured in any written or online AAW publication, except for within articles that warn against its use. AAW publications will not accept advertisements for any products or supplies directly related to the process."

ANNOUNCEMENT

World of Wood had a burglary one evening the week of May 22, 2017. Quite a bit of new equipment and tools, pyrography equipment, lathes, etc. were stolen. The police may have caught the culprit but as a favor to our member and owner of World of Wood, Jake Jacobson, please be on the lookout for new turning tools and equipment being offered for sale. Do not attempt to recover items yourself but do please report anything suspicious to the Albuquerque Police Department.

MAY 6 PRESENTATION:

Trent Bosch demonstrated at the May 6, 2017 regular meeting of the NMWT. The following are notes taken.

His first demo was his "Vessel of Illusion" which is a fairly typical open vessel but with an insert of wood which appears impossible.



Safety was first to be discussed. We need to be in a right state of mind for turning. Any mental distraction can lead to an accident. As a minimum ALWAYS use safety glasses and a face shield.

Trent uses a bowl gouge most of the time, swept back shape at 60 degree bevel. His tool choice is personal and admits there are many ways to get the same results. He discussed chuck types from Vicmarc with dovetail jaws to Oneway with flat serrated jaws. Both work fine as long at the tenon on the work is prepared accordingly. Holding power of either chuck is best with the jaws being less than ½" of gap when tight using a spindle detail gouge for final shaping of the tenon. Keep

the tail stock in place as long as possible which keeps stability of the workpiece.

Trent does not hone cutting tools but uses them directly from the grinder. Height of lathe is important – the center of turning should be about elbow height of the turner. Not adjusting for this can cause problems in the back and shoulders. Drill center of vessel to final depth then hollow using bowl gouge then hollowing tools. Trent makes his own hollowing tools using HHS M2 cutters. These can be purchased on his website – www.trentbosch.com. As you hollow, you can judge the finish thickness of the vessel by the higher pitch as you get thinner. He uses hollowing tools in a negative angle making it a "negative angle scraper". After vessel is turned, any design of carving can follow and he discussed several hand and power tools on the market. On this vessel he makes an insert of contrasting wood to put in the "mouth". This insert is turned thin, then soaked in wood to make it pliable, then it is inserted using a balloon to clamp the insert from the inside while the glue dries. Sounds complicated but it isn't really, just innovative! He uses epoxy because epoxy tends to move slightly over time with the wood.

This project can be briefly seen at YouTube by entering "Trent Bosch Vessel of Illusion" Trent went on to demonstrate the turning of a 12" dia. by 3 ½" high bowl using basically the same turning techniques as above. He finished by turning a platter.

All this turning was accomplished using very sharp tools, keeping tail stock in place as long as possible, "riding the bevel" on swept back grind of bowl gouge.

Beads of Courage challenge: We need enough entries to fill a display case at the State Fair this year. Don't be shy, we can do it. The size of the box, as a minimum, must be 5 inches wide x 6 inches deep. These boxes do not have to be round, they can also square. Of course, you can

make them larger, to allow the kiddo's to put all their beads in a safe place. Go to www.beadsofcourage.org to see to whom you will be making these boxes. Don't forget to bring your boxes to the meetings, and put them into the instant gallery. Scott Eckstein is our official representative for the local hospitals, give him your box(s) for delivery to the hospitals.

Items not sold will be returned to the owner and the owner will remove the items from Woodworkers Supply.
