Michael Andersen will be presenting finishing techniques for wood. Some of the topics he will be discussing will be:


- · Double dying burl

- · Bleaching Bleaching a piece of Ebony white and staining a piece of Holly black
- · Burning burning ash to bring out the grain as well as burning and lacquering as done in Japan
- · Iron and Vinegar Staining oak
- Wire brushing and bootleg sandblasting
- · If time allows, using a spray epoxy canoe finish


Above: A Wheel of Delicacy sporting hand drawn and painted flowers and vines.

Below: Due to COVID-19, Michael has put in much effort to join the ranks of the finest remote woodturning demonstrators. His ability to demonstrate and be personable online make it seem as if he's been doing it for years!

In July, Michael Alguire demonstrated his signature piece the Wheel of Delicacy. From start to finish, Michael clearly explained his process, shared tips and tricks for accurate woodturning and offered insight into shaping his stunning, seemingly weightless wheels and forms.

Again, using Zoom, we all had a "front-row seat" to the show and Michael used several angles to capture his turning technique, measuring process and that comfy chair where the real magic of piercing brings these pieces to life. We truly enjoyed sitting in Michael's shop with him.


Michael began by describing the ideal timbers and grain structure for these pieces. He strongly recommends closed grain, hardwood such as maple, cherry, mahogany and even padauk and purple heart should you want to put most of that exotic wood on the floor.






Above: Michael demonstrates meticulous care to obtain very high tolerances on his stock. This is essential so that the two mating pieces can fit seamlessly together on the outside and inside. He takes light cuts, measures often and ensures squareness.

Below: Michael uses a combination of his specific-profiled negative rake scraper and a bowl gouge to refine the outside of the wheel prior to flipping around and hollowing the inside with Trent Bosch style hollowing tools. He also drills depth holes to prepare him for consistency when hollowing the inside.





Above, Michael demonstrates how to turn the inside to specifications to complete the one half of the wheel. Below, Michael shows how he uses dowel and hot glue to line up the two halves properly. He then shows, on specific demonstration piece, the air tool and bit he uses on the inside. He also strategically pierces where he put depth holes to give him feedback on his hollowing.







Michael is a wealth of knowledge! His techniques are precise and accurate – somewhat attributed to his machinist background. However, he has the artistic mind to allow the piece to come about as it flows from his head and heart. Charlotte Anderson informed former club president, Larry Linford, that her husband Larry passed away on July 4, 2020. Larry was an active club member and most recently donated gallons and gallons of Anchorseal to the club to support activities, raffles and presentation. He will be greatly missed!

#### Frank Warren, Sr.:

John Ellis wrote this beautiful epitaph on July 5, 2020

It is with great sadness that I send out the information that my dear friend, Frank Warren, Sr., passed away this morning. Frank was a member of NMWT for over 10 years and was still an active wood turner. He was 87 and died in Presbyterian Hospital from complications of an infection. His wife Kennie was with him.

Until the past year or two Frank was a constant attendee at our workshops and even loved to demonstrate at the State Fair. Even though his health was a constant challenge, he spent much of his time in his shop. He not only turned but loved to make wooden toys for kids that were distributed by AWA at Christmas time. Over the last 10 or 12 years he made at least several thousand. He was awarded a KOB Channel 4 "Pay It Forward" recently by the Rio Rancho Police for the donation of toys for their distribution. He always welcomed anyone into his shop to help with the toys and paid for much of the materials himself.

Frank served in the US Coast Guard and was an avid radio operator, who up until the last few years still gave qualifying examinations to ham radio operators in northern New Mexico. During the I spent with Frank in his shop in Rio Rancho, there was always a radio going with Morse Code in the background. Occasionally Frank would stop and tell me something he had just heard. His mind was able to automatically interpret the code even when he wasn't really listening.

As my close friend, I spent many happy hours with him, sometimes woodworking, but mostly chatting and talking about the many subjects he was interested in. Our time together was filled with joy and happiness. I shall miss him greatly. At this time there are no memorial arrangements.




