December Interactive Remote Demo:

The Lidded Bowl

with Glenn Lucas

This month Glenn Lucas will be demonstrating turning a lidded bowl – perfect timing if you are thinking of holiday gifts to turn.

Glenn's Lidded Bowl is really three projects in one – a closed form, a beaded bowl and a box. In this live woodturning demo Glenn will talk us through each step of making this piece. Many turners are using this lidded bowl for the **Beads of Courage initiative.**

Glenn Lucas has an international reputation for his proficiency at the lathe and his ability to pass on to students the skills and knowledge he has gained. He balances his production of classic bowls turned from native Irish wood (set up in 1995), with an extensive teaching program run from his Co. Carlow 'Woodturning Study Centre' (since 2005). In September 2020 he will move into a newly developed purpose-designed woodturning training center.

A frequent guest Demonstrator at overseas conferences, he also gives Turning Masterclasses at international arts and crafts schools, currently through Interactive Remote Demonstrations, remote tuition and virtual symposia.

Beads of Courage – NMWT's 2021 Challenge



Beads of Courage is the NMWT's Community Service Project. Beads of Courage, Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) tax exempt organization working in partnership with the American Association of Woodturners (AAW).

Our Beads of Courage Bowls are taken directly to UNMH Children's Cancer Facility here in Albuquerque for local patients. However, bowls can also be sent to a National collection point in Tucson, Arizona.

UNMH Children's Cancer Facility has been treating nearly one hundred seriously ill cancer youngsters each year. For each medical treatment a child receives, he or she gets a bead which they can then keep in their bowl, hence Beads of Courage Bowls. The children do receive a bag to put their beads in but a Beads of Courage Bowl is far more special and reflective of the hard work to beat cancer!

November's Demo: Photographing Your Turnings



For November, we had the pleasure of hearing from accomplished photographer Woody Stone. Woody instructed us on how to capture our turnings to preserve the items that we have poured our time and energy into preparing for the day we may not be able to hold them again – for posterity's sake. Just like any task in woodturning, if you were to ask 10 woodturners how to photograph your work you would get 11 answers. However, Woody provided us with a high level overview of many factors that impact your photography. Woody first addressed a place to shoot by creating ideal conditions for the many other factors including light, shadows, depth of field, exposure time, proportions and more.



Build this Photobooth:

Materials:

- 6 pieces of ½" Sched 40 Side outlet 90 elbow ("corner")
- 2 pieces of 1/2" Sched 40 90 elbow
- 11 @ 36" long ½ Sched 40 pipe
- 3 @ 36"x36" cloth panels (finished dimension)
- 1 @ 36" wide x 72" long blackout or shower curtain (finished dimension)

Instructions:

- 1. Sew three cloth panels approximately 36" by 36" with a through pocket on each end large enough to slide pipe into. A finished panel with 36"x36" will fit well and stay taut between pipes
- 2. Sew a backdrop using curtain material of choice so that it contains one through pocket to slide through.
- **3.** Form two side assemblies of PVC pipe using 3 "corner" pieces and one elbow. Pieces should fit together snuggly with friction for a take-down booth. Panels slide on vertically
- **4.** Connect the two side assemblies with remaining 3 pipe pieces at the top front, top back and bottom back corners. Top panel slides onto horizontal right and left pipes.
- Attach lighting of choice and drape background curtain so it has a pleasing curve. Background slide onto the horizontal pipe in the top back.


PRODUCT PHOTO SHOOT WOOD BOWL


Web-Based Credit Card Dues Payment Now Available

Most of our NMWT memberships are currently set up on a calendar year basis with expirations at the end of December. So now is the time to start renewing memberships for 2021 and beyond for those who need to (your current membership expiration date should be listed on your membership card).

We are very pleased to announce that you can now pay your membership dues with a credit card on the NMWT website at https://www.nmwoodturners.org/. To access online dues payment, simply go to the new "Membership" tab near the top of the homepage and select "Pay Online" from the dropdown menu. This will take you to a secure website managed by Converge, our credit card service provider. There you will find a series of "Buy Buttons" that are clearly labeled with each membership dues option (i.e. 1 Yr Individual Membership \$25, 2 Yr Family Membership \$55, etc.) Simply select the dues option that you want and then hit the "Checkout" button. You will need to fill in all of the contact information on the payment processing page so that the Treasurer can confirm that our membership records are up to date and also so that he can send your new membership card by regular mail. Also, due to some reporting limitations of the Converge website, you will need to once again select the dues option you want from the drop-down menu labeled "Items Purchased". Fill in your credit card information and hit the "Submit Payment" button to complete the transaction. You should receive an "Order Confirmation" with full details of your purchase by e-mail, and the Treasurer with mail your membership card to you. That's all there is to it!

You can, of course, still mail a check along with current contact and e-mail information to our Treasurer, Mark Smith at 709 Vista Abajo Dr. NE, Albuquerque, NM 87123. The easy way to do that is to go to that same new "Membership" tab on the NMWT homepage and select "Membership Form" from the drop-down menu. Fill in the form (PLEASE PRINT CLEARLY) and mail it to Mark with your check. Should you have any issues or questions regarding the new Credit Card payment system or if you are not sure if your membership expires at the end of 2020, feel free to call Mark at 505-270-6316 or e-mail him at mfsmithabq@msn.com.

Mark will also start sending out reminder e-mails to those whose memberships expire in December within the next couple of weeks. We hope that the new dues payment option encourages members to renew soon as the club has operated in the red for most of this year due to COVID and the resulting loss of normal revenue streams such as raffles, silent auctions, etc. It is also easier on the Treasurer if the membership renewals are spread out a bit rather than everyone waiting until the last minute to renew.




Additionally, the NMWTs are branching out into the world of YouTube. Our first few videos are snippets from a mid-month virtual social gathering where sharpening was shared.

Editor's Catch




Most of you may not know what I do for work. I have kept it fairly quiet, even more so this year, that I am a healthcare provider in a busy intensive care unit here in central New Mexico. Side note: over 50% of our almost 200 inpatients are "positive" as of typing this. Since March we have lived a strange life – almost a double life – where one life is all work and icky germs and the other life is away from work doing all we can to avoid germs but trying to be normal and blend in. It's been quite unique and my "therapy" of woodturning has never been more important.

You see, and you are free to agree or not, I am extremely unlikely to catch the current disease that plagues our nation and world *while at work*. We don personal protective equipment (PPE) from head to toe, wash or alcohol our hands, do our cares and tasks, doff our PPE, wash and alcohol our hands and move on to the next patient never removing our face protection (there's a turning lesson in there). I am extremely confident that my colleagues and fellow team members put my safety, our patient's safety and their individual safety as the top priority when caring for the vulnerable folks for whom we are working. In my neck of the healthcare woods, I do not see the success stories – my patients are the small percentage you see or read about – they are the fathers, mothers, daughters, sons, grandpas, grandmas who succumb to this pandemic. Long story short: it's exhausting and I am tuckered out but we press on because we love our patients and our work!

Earlier in November I was really worn out. Patience worn thin. Time for my "therapy" worn thinner. Desire and motivation to feed my soul was Bible-paper or gold-leaf thin. Something had to happen. Well, I escaped! I solitarily drove to Provo, Utah, and took a 3-day Woodturning 201 class with Scott Cherry and Kirk DeHeer at the Dale L. Nish School of Woodturning where class size was reduced and spaced out. I met my best friend, a fellow caregiver needing escape, and we enjoyed a wonderful 3 days with each other and old friends making shavings fly all while maintaining our face protection. There we found our burdens lifted. Making shavings, we peeled away (with the grain) stress and angst. Sharpening gouges, we ground away worry, tension and other people's steel (haha). We needed it and we went after it. Were we at risk? Darn right we were! But you can bet we continued to protect ourselves, and protect others, because of what we've seen. Despite the risk versus benefit, we had to find a source of joy amongst the despair. And that we did! However, we did it responsibly and respectfully. I hope that you have not waited as long as I did to feed the soul. And, if woodturning is soul food, Go EAT (wearing face protection)!!!
